CATTLEYA CULTURE NOTES (AUG/SEPT 2009) by Henry Eaton

August is usually cold and wet but this year it seems drier and slightly warmer than before. There is now a hint of sunnier days and afternoons can be quite bright. Yet because of the cold nights, precautions have to be taken with watering your plants so that they do not remain with very wet roots by night time. A slight increase in the frequency of watering is in order, while a little fertilizer can be used following watering. Any shade that had been removed over the plants need not yet be re-applied. The plants will benefit from the increased light and warmth. Flowering growths will have to be protected from snails and slugs and staked erect so as to present the flowers well.

As we get into September the need for potting, re-potting and dividing plants will be on us. It is therefore time now to get together the bark, pots and other ingredients you may need to use in your mix, as well as stakes etc. The best time to pot a Cattleya is as soon as you find new roots appearing on the forward growths. Pot these plants up while the roots are only 1-2 cms long so that they can immediately grow into the new mix and establish the plant. The forward growth needs to be securely staked at this time so that unnecessary movement will not damage the new roots.

CYMBIDIUM CULTURE NOTES (AUG/SEPT. 2009) by Roy Brown

We are now entering into the Spring months, when we see the majority of our Cymbidiums flowering once again. Also these are the months when the orchid societies hold their annual Spring Shows, so give your plants that are in spike that little bit of extra care and attention, and enter them into the shows so that everyone else can enjoy them with you.

Seeing as the Spring Shows are just around the corner, perhaps I should start off this month with a few hints on preparing your plants for exhibition. First, give the pots a good clean up. Next, wipe the plant leaves with a soft, damp, clean cloth, or if you like, use a very weak solution of white oil and water. Trim up the ends of the leaves, some may have dead tips and these can look rather unsightly; always remember to sterilise the cutting instrument after attending to each plant. Then, probably the most important point, make sure the plants that need it are properly staked so they present their flowers in the proper manner. It doesn't take long to prepare each plant for a show, but it does make all the difference to the finished product. Finally, on the morning of the show, give your plants a good watering; they may have to be on display for 3 or 4 days.

You should be hard at it with the dividing and repotting by now, and by doing each plant in turn after it has flowered, this will save you a lot of last minute, hurried work at the end of October.

The Orchid Society of WA Winter Show

The Orchid Society of WA held their Winter Show at the Scout & Guide Hall in South Perth on the 18th & 19th July. The show was quite well patronized with 117 plants being entered, which was really good considering the weather experienced throughout the weekend. Congratulations to all the winners. Results were as follows:

Grand Champion & Champion Paph. Was Paph. Michael Koopowitz 'Cassandra', a Multifloral which was a well grown and presented plant, displaying 3 flowers and a bud. The 30 cm long petals were burgundy, the sepals a honey colour with distinctive burgundy stripes. The owners were Ken & Stephanie Clarke.

Reserve Champion & Best Cymbidium was Cym. Margaret Thatcher x (Valley Legend x Margaret Thatcher 'Awesome') grown to perfection by Phil Taylor. There were 4 racemes of large, well rounded, iridescent yellow flowers with striking labellums flecked & edged with red.

Best Laeliinae Alliance - Blc. Passion 'Peta' was benched by K & S Clarke. A strong, healthy looking plant with two 15 cm. Dark lilac flowers & a further 4 buds still to open.

Best Species - *Paph. moquettianum,* a progressive flowering, very pretty Paph. with a sage green dorsal, pink/mauve pouch & evenly twisted hairy, dotted/lined petals. The flower was well presented on a tall stem. The owner was Phil Taylor.

Besst Seedling other than a Paph. - Zygo. Koscuisko 'Trek' x Mpp. Adelaide 'Crote' had 4 striking flowers evenly spaced on a tall raceme. Petals & sepals were very evenly marked in rich brown & green and the rich purple striped labellum set off the flower. Tabled by Jim &

Best Australian Native Species - *Dendrobium bigibbum* var. *superbum forma alba*. Small but a very good shape, it had 2 flowers & 1 bud. Tabled by Ian Duncan.

Best Australian Native Hybrid - Den. Hilda Poxon. A showy plant with 8 racemes covered in blooms of good size and shape. Owner was Ian Duncan

Best any Other Genera - Phalaenopsis Unknown tabled by Phil Taylor. Eight large, beautifully presented, deep pink well shaped blooms on a tall arching raceme.

AOC Most Pre-eminent Entry - Den. Hilda Poxon with 16 racemes of yellow striped red flowers well spaced on tall racemes, sitting above the foliage. A very striking plant, tabled by Tom & Ellen Dixon.

Best Novice - Blc. Dream Trader tabled by John & Dorothy Walton. Two very large, flat, soft lilac flowers (12.5 cm) were well presented on a tall stem.

Display - The overall display was spectacular with all orchids arranged to show the individual beauty of each one. A very large variety of genera were on display with colours ranging from delicate whites through soft pinks, gold, & greens to vibrant reds. It was pleasing to see some very unusual blooms exhibited as well.

July Meeting Highlights

Popular vote - Novice: John Walton was justifiably proud of his Blc. Dream Trader, which is a cross of Blc. Sylvia Fry and C. Horace, registered in 1990. Like its parents, Blc. Dream Trader has large, well shaped predominantly pink flowers.

Popular vote - Open: Maxine Godbeer's *Laelia anceps* var. *veitchiana*. The flowers of this varietal form are not the pink usually seen for *Laelia anceps*, but instead are white with a blue/mauve labellum. Maxine grows this orchid at the front of her shade house where it receives a lot of light and air movement. It receives a lot of water in summer but uis kept drier in winter (and is protected from the rain). *Laelia anceps* var. *veitchiana* is native to Mexico.

Ansellia nilotica: This plant was brought in by Ian Duncan. *Ansellia nilotica* is considered a synonym for *Ansellia africana*, although, as Ian pointed out, this specimen looked a bit different to the *Ansellia africana* specimens we usually see, with more elongated pseudo bulbs and yellow flowers devoid of brown markings. This plant originally belonged to Bob Jones. Ian found that the flowers "wogged off" when the plant was grown in the shade house during cold weather, but developed well in the glass house.

Floral art: Kaye gave an interesting demonstration of the art of floral art. She hates to waste anything from the garden and used small branches, fern & begonia leaves, Spanish moss, asparagus foliage, a succulent and even the woody leaf from a palm flower to complement orchids in floral artworks. Kaye showed how to use these natural materials in conjunction with oasis, thin wire, decorative wire, and stretchy parafilm tape to make beautiful and intricate pieces.
