### CYMBIDIUM CULTURE NOTES (JUNE/JULY 2009) by Roy Brown

The next two months are cold, wet months with windy and blustery weather. Cymbidiums will grow quite well under these cold wet conditions provided the pots have good drainage, allowing all the excess rain water to drain away freely. Strong wind can tip the pots over and off the benches, causing the plants leaves to be broken and bent, also snapping off the young flower spikes. I would advise you to protect the pots from very blustery weather.

Should you experience frosts in your area, you will have to bring those plants in spike under cover when frosts are forecast, otherwise the flower spike will wither and die if frost settles on it overnight.

The flower spikes will need to be trained as they develop if you want them to be presentable. Don't just allow them to grow out over the edge of the pot in an unruly fashion. Tie them up to the stakes and train them so that eventually when the flowers open, they will present themselves in a pleasing manner. This does make a difference to the whole appearance of the plant, and if you are going to exhibit the plant in any of the forthcoming shows, this is an absolute must.

If you are discarding any of the older leaves from the pseudo bulbs, then pick them up from the shade house floor. Don't leave them lying around to rot, this is where insect pests could breed. Keep the Cymbidium house nice and clean, free from weeds and rubbish,

### CATTLEYA CULTURE NOTES (JUNE/JULY 2009) By Henry Eaton

Winter temperatures during these months are usually between 8C at night and 18C during the day. This year however we have been getting even colder nights and slightly higher daytime temperatures. Cattleyas grown cold in a covered shade-house, out of the rain, will be able to survive these conditions. The danger is that of watering these plants on a cold day with even lower temperatures at night. These conditions may lead to roots rotting from being too cold and wet at night. Adjust your watering schedule to take advantage of bright sunny days, so that roots can dry out appreciably before a cold night. This also means that watering, maybe once or twice a fortnight, may be all that is needed. Judge the need for watering by lifting up some pots and assessing whether they feel light or heavy. If very light this indicates a low water level and watering is indicated. Fertilizers are not needed at this time, apart from those plants showing signs of growth such as new growths or roots. I find that some of the species plants are producing new growths at present.

As this is a peak flowering time of the year, keep a watch out for the appearance of buds without a sheath, and also flowering sheaths. Keep water out of the axils of these leaves to avoid rotting the buds. To ensure this, peeling away the sheaths may be an option. As always, stake the flowering growths up straight and support the buds by tying the raceme to a stake, especially if the sheath has been removed. Use snail bait as needed and also keep a lookout for small caterpillars.

### **O.S.W.A AUTUMN SHOW & CHAMPIONSHIP**

Our Autumn show this year was held at Stockland Riverton Shopping Centre from May 6th—9th. Plant entries were down somewhat, which was to be expected with two other clubs holding shows over the same period, nonetheless a very beautiful display was created much to the delight of many shoppers.

Peter & Shirley Masters were the owners of Blc.Sweet Honey - a lovely, large, cerise coloured bloom which won Champion Laeliinae Alliance and was finally judged Grand Champion.

Reserve Champion was Sharon Lyster's *Den. bigibbum*, a small plant with 5 racemes of well shaped purple flowers with deep purple in the lip. This plant also won Best Dendrobium and Best A.N. Orchid species.

Best Cymbidium was Cym. Florida Cracker 'Marmalade' grown by Ross & Alice Lang. The varietal name well described this intermediate with attractive deep yellow flowers with a reddish tinge.

Best Paphiopedilum went to Jim & Kaye Baylis for their *Paph. insigne* var. *sanderae* an attractive variant of the more common type, having green petals and yellowy-green labellum.

Best Any Other Genera was *Phal. mariae*, a delightful little plant with lots of small flowers, white barred reddish brown with a purple lip. The owner was Maxine Godbeer.

Best Species, another of Maxine Godbeer's plants was *Bulbophyllum rothschildianum* carrying six flowers. The unusual flowers with their long tails are not commonly seen at shows.

Best Seedling, Blc. Campabella x Malworth was tabled by Sharon Lyster. The donor parent was quite evident in the flowers which were a soft yellow with orangey red in the lip. Showed good potential when the plant is more developed.

The Best Novice Entry was C. Khali Blue 'Delph Beauty' grown by Merrilyn Brechin. Merrilyn's well grown plant carried 5 racemes with a total of 39 beautiful mauve blooms.

A.O.C. Most Pre=Eminent Entry went to HowearaMary Eliza, a truly eye-catching exhibit from Peter & Shirley Masters collection. Their well grown plant which covered a piece of tree fern approx. 45 cm long, carried lots of small yellow flowers spotted reddish brown.

Congratulations, not only to the winners, but to all those who contributed in the making of such a lovely display.
