

CATTLEYA CULTURE NOTES (OCTOBER/NOVEMBER 2009) by Henry Eaton

As the weather becomes warmer & and the intensity of light increases together with longer hours of daylight, your plants will be showing signs of growth. This may be manifest in the appearance of new growths or the development of new roots on the lead growths. This is a sign for potting on or repotting your plants especially with the appearance on new roots. Do not let them get any longer than a cm or two before dealing with them as they are vulnerable to breakage if any longer.

When repotting plants take the opportunity to examine them thoroughly by removing all dry sheaths on them in order to expose any scale or other insect pests. Deal with the scale by spraying with white oil or pest oil which suffocates the insects. Check the roots too if the plant has been heavily infested and deal with any that are there too. If there are any dried up old pseudo bulbs on the plant remove them. Remove too any dead or broken roots. If after all this the plant has more than eight pseudo bulbs it can considered for subdivision into two plants. It is best to have at least four viable pseudo bulbs on each division to ensure success. Choose a pot that will accommodate about two years growth before repotting is again required. The mix that you choose will depend on the time and frequency that you give to watering the plants. The larger the pine bark the more frequent the watering while fine bark holds water for longer. Coir seems to hold water longer and spaghnam even longer still. Hold the oldest pseudo bulb against the back edge of the pot and then the moistened mix is poured in around the roots. Firm down the rnix so that the plant is securely anchored. If there is any suggestion of instability then drive in a stake and tie the leading bulb to it. If the plant is securely potted you should be able to lift the pot off the table by clutching the leaves alone. Return the plant to a shay spot in your growing area and water well with a seaweed extract to counter the shock of division or repotting.

Extra shading may not be necessary as yet but watering may have to be more frequent remembering though, that Cattleyas like wet/dry cycles. Fertilising with a higher nitrogen based fertilizer can also begin and be used weekly or fortnightly.

CYMBIDIUM CULTURE NOTES (OCTOBER/NOVEMBER 2009) by Roy Brown

November brings an end to the current flowering season for Cymbidiums. Some of the late flowering varieties will still be in bloom and these will need to be placed in the coolest and shadiest position possible. It is not good practice to keep the flower spikes on the plant for too long as they are a drain on the pseudo bulbs.

Once the flower spikes are cut off the new seasons growth will appear with the warmer sunny days ahead and the plants will make fast growth.

By now you should have the biggest part of your repotting done. If you still have a few left that need dividing, I would suggest that you get these done by the second week of November at the latest. After this time the weather becomes too hot and the plants don't have sufficient time to become established before summer sets in.

From now on with the increase in temperature, we will have to increase the watering too. In the hotter months Cymbidiums will take all the water you can give them, provided of course the pots have very good drainage.

For the next six months, that is up until next April, it is the growing period for Cymbidiums. During this time the plants will form new bulbs and produce the next season's flower spikes. In order to grow them successfully we must be prepared to see that they get the three main necessities: Plenty of water—ample light—and a well balanced fertiliser.

OSWA SPRING SHOW

Our Spring Show was held from 2nd—5th September, once again in the Kardinya Park Shopping Centre. There were a good number of plants entered in a wide range of genera and these were tastefully arranged into four colourful island displays.

Grand Champion of the Show / **Best Species other than A.N.** / **Best Any Other Genera** was Jack & Betty Rensen's *Den. Spectabile.* This well grown plant carried 3 tall racemes with over 30 blooms in all and another 2 racemes in bud. The unusual flowers were cream with reddish-brown markings on the wavy segments which were long, pointed and twisted.

Reserve Champion / Best Phalaenopsis was Phal. Orchidworld "Bonnie Vasquez", another of Jack & Betty Rensen's plants. This orchid, which always catches the eye, had 5 well shaped blooms of good substance on 2 racemes. They were a gorgeous bright yellow with dark red concentric markings and a purple labellum.

Champion Cymbidium—Cym. Glendale "Royal Globe" was tabled by Ross & Alice Lang. A most attractive exhibit with 32 beautiful pink blooms well displayed on 3 racemes.

Best Laeliinae Alliance-Rhyncholaelia glauco. 8 flowers with pale green sepals and large white labellum on a well grown plant which was mounted on a piece of wooden board. The owners were Anne & Geoff O'Callaghan.

Best Paphiopedilum— Paph. Fanaticum "Steph" (*Paph. Micranthum x malipoense*). A large flower on a 45cm stem. This lovely slipper had all segments white, overlaid with red-purple, the sepals were heavily veined. An outstanding Paph. Displayed by Ken & Stephanie Clarke.

Best Cymbidium Seedling– Cym. Bewitched Baker x (Ruby Eyes x Last Tango). Another lovely Cymbidium exhibited by Ross & Alice Lang. 8 red blooms, with a darker red lip, were nicely displayed on the stem.

Best Seedling Other than a Cymbidium– Den. speciosum tabled by Ian Duncan. Two racemes of evenly spaced yellow blooms on this lovely Australian Native.

Best A.N. Orchid Species— *Den. teretifolium.* A mass of creamish white blooms on this well grown plant tabled by Anne & Geoff O'Callaghan.

Best A.N. Orchid Hybrid / Best A. N. Specimen / Best Novice— Den. Zip Imperial x Den. Peter Royal exhibited by Merril Brechin. A very well grown plant displaying numerous white blooms blotched with pink.

Best Specimen Any Genera other than A.N.—Paph. Papyrus "Wylde Court". An eye catching plant with 7 flowers, grown by Jim & Kaye Baylis. A standard type with a white dorsal infused with strong reddish colouration.

AOC Moist Pre Emminent Entry: *Den. teretifolium.* Anne & Geoff O'Callaghan's spectacular plant, commonly known as the "bridal veil orchid".

Congratulations not only to the winners, but to all involved in creating the beautiful display and in the making of a very successful show. The Shopping Centre has requested our Spring Show be held there in 2010.

NOTICE OF MOTIONS

Motion 1: That the change recommended by the Committee to the rules covering entry of plants for shows conducted by The Orchid Society of WA as presented at our September meeting be rejected by this General Meeting.

Motion 2: Changes to be made to the Orchid Society of WA (Inc) By-Laws.

1. Interpretations and Definitions

Amend clause (b) (iii) to read "Exhibitor" shall mean a member of the Society, a member of a society that is a member of the Australian Orchid Council, any person that is a Personal Member of the Australian Orchid Council, or any person approved by the Committee who benches a plant at any show or meeting of the Society.

- 1. By-Laws Relating to Awards and Judging—(1994) as Amended
 - 1. Delegation of Powers of Management Committee
 - ,(a) After the words "delegate to the" delete the words "Judging Panel" and insert "Australian Orchid Council WA Regional Judging Panel" and place a full stop after the word "Society" and delete the words "or an affiliated society" in the last line.
 - (b) Delete clause (b)
 - (c) Clause (c) Delete the words "Judging Panel" in the last line and include the words "Australian Orchid Council WA Regional Judging Panel"

The following sections to be deleted:

- 2. Appointment, Duties and Powers of the Judging Panel.
- 3. Appointment, Powers and Duties of the Chairman and Deputy Chairman.
- 4. Duties of the Registrar/Deputy Registrar
- 5. Appointment of Judges, Associate Judges and Student Judges.
- 6. Duties of Judges, Associate Judges and Student Judges.
- 7. Awards.
- 8. Submission for an Award.
- Judging for Awards
- 10. Judging Procedure for Awards.
- 11. Ratification of Awards.
- 13. Judging Procedures at a General Meeting or Show.

Section 12. to be renumbered as 2. and the following new clauses to be added:

- (r) Any exhibitor that is not a member of The Society may only be eligible to win a Grand Champion of a Show once in any 12 month period.
- (s) Perpetual Trophies may only be held by members of The Society.

Regional Judging Panels—All clauses to be deleted.

The section "Affiliated Societies" is also to be deleted.
