WINTER STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS & SHOW

Grand Champion/ Best of any other Genera: Owned by Jack & Betty Rensen this plant was Phalaenopsis (Musashino x Hsinying White) x Phal. Ginre Ching Hua. A well grown plant had one fully opened arching spray of 7 large (4") white flowers of good shape. A second stem was partially opened.

Reserve Champion/ Best Australian Native Hybrid/ and AOC Most Pre-eminent Entry was Den. Hilda Poxon, owned by Ian Duncan. This was a large, well grown plant with many beautifully presented, large yellow flowers, very lightly spotted with red.

Best Seedling: *Phal. amabilis* x Phal. Hsinying Little Pearl 'Snow White' grown by Jack & Betty Rensen. This plant carried six 3" well shaped, clean white flowers.

Best Laeliinae Alliance: Blc. Sweet Margaret owned by Phil Taylor, was a very well grown plant carrying a single 6" white flower.

Best Paphiopedilum: Paph. Highland Luck, a very well presented flower with a 3" spotted dorsal, was grown by Howard Tan

Best Phragmipedium: Phrag. Schroederae, a large pink flower on a well grown plant, was owned by Phil Taylor

Best species: *Amesiella monticola,* showed a good shaped white flower on a very small plant.

Best Paphiopedilum Seedling: grown by Phil Taylor, Paph. Lambert Bay 'Maybrooks Omega' x Paph. Joan Thomas 'Primo'. This plant had two 3" blooms (1 fully open and 1 partially open) which were a yellow/green colour.

Best Cymbidium: Cym. Eileen's Dream 'Mary' was another winner grown by Phil Taylor and carried an erect spike of sixteen 3" green/yellow flowers, which presented themselves very nicely

Best Novice Entry: Cym. Celtic Imp 'Sharon' carried three pendulous sprays of about 15 flowers on each, and another stem still to open. This plant was owned by Ann & Malcolm Davis.

Best Junior Entry: Dana Mitchell with *Paph. insigne* exhibiting three lovely, well presented flowers

Most Plants entered in Open: Phil Taylor (30)

Most Plants entered in Novice: John & Dorothy Walton & Tom & Pat Stacy (equal 5 entries)

Best Floral Art: An arrangement using Croton leaves, Cordalyne leaves and miniature brown/pink orchid flowers was exhibited by Meg Donald.

CYMBIDIUM CULTURAL NOTES (AUGUST /SEPTEMBER 2010) by Roy Brown

We are now moving towards the Spring months, and this means more and more of our Cymbidiums will be opening their flower buds. During July the flower buds were rather slow in opening due to the very cold nights and mornings, so during August we should see quite a difference with plenty of nicely opened Cymbidium flowers.

Take particular care with the staking of the flower stems; they should be upright and displaying their flowers to the best advantage. There are exceptions of course for those Cymbidiums that have naturally arching sprays of flowers or those that grow in a hanging basket that produce flower stems that naturally hang downward from the pseudo bulbs.

Spring is the time for repotting those plants that have filled the pot and must be repotted. Do not leave those flower stems on your plants for too long, cut them and enjoy them indoors. By doing this, plants will be more likely to send up new growths which will have the benefit of 12 months growing before it is time to flower again next year.

Now a few tips on preparing your plants for exhibition in the Spring Shows.

Firstly give the pots a good clean up, this will show that the owner cares a little about his or her plants. Next, wipe over the leaves with a soft damp cloth, if you like use a <u>very</u> weak solution of white oil and water. Do not give the Cymbidium's leaves an oily look, besides looking unnatural it can also effect the efficiency of the leaves by blocking the pores. Should some of the leaves have dead tips, then trim these down. Always remember to sterilize your cutting instrument after dealing with each plant, don't accidently spread any hidden diseases from plant to plant. Top up the pot with fresh compost or pine bark if the surface has dropped lower than the rim of the pot. Then, probably the most important point, make sure those plants that need it are properly staked so the they present their flowers in the proper manner, this could please the judges.

CATTLEYA CULTURAL NOTES (AUGUST/SEPTEMBER 2010) by Henry Eaton

We are now coming into the blooming season where the last of your plants will complete their annual flowering. To present the flowers well, make sure the pseudo bulbs are tied vertically and the emerging buds face towards the main source of light. Be careful with watering, as water remaining on the flowers by nightfall may lead to spotting with Botrytis fungus, ruining your display. If there are any bud sheaths that hold water, peel them open or remove them altogether. To avoid spotting, water them early in the morning on a bright day so that they can dry off by nightfall. Good luck with your efforts.

This is also the time to think of repotting. Gather together the pots and potting mix you will require. Your choice of mix should be based on the time you can spare to thoroughly water your plants, thinking especially of summer when it is hot, and you would rather stay inside than out. Also think in terms of how long you would like to go between pottings. The finer the mix it tends to break down faster, and this means more frequent potting. Also small plants will need a finer mix than adult flowering ones. Finer mix also holds more water and less air between particles. Repotting should start as soon as you see new roots appearing from the pseudo bulbs and before they get longer than 2-3 cms.
