CYMBIDIUM CULTURE NOTES (JANUARY/FEBRUARY 2010) by Roy Brown

Possibly the biggest problem we have here in Western Australia when growing Cymbidiums, is the hot and dry summer conditions. We are subjected to long periods of above century temperatures, and this coupled with the hot drying effect of the easterly winds, does not help in the culture of Cymbidiums. However over the years, we have learned to combat these adverse conditions.

To combat the lack of humidity, we have to make use of our sprinkler systems and so keep the Cymbidium house as cool and damp as possible. Watering the plants should be carried out twice a day from now on, first thing in the morning and again at night, making the evening watering the heaviest one. Use a fine mist spray and thoroughly saturate the compost and surrounding area.

Another way to help create humidity is to spread a thick layer of sawdust on the ground under and around the benches. This helps to hold moisture and helps to keep the area nice and damp.

It is during the summer months that the flower spikes are initiated, and it is imperative the plants receive a marked drop in nightly temperature so that this action takes place. This is why I advocate the evening watering to be the heaviest, as this will bring down the temperature in the shade house quite a few degrees.

CATTLEYA CULTURE NOTES (JANUARY/FEBRUARY 2010) by Henry Eaton

Culture for this month must take into account the wide variations in weather expected. Average temperatures at this time of the year vary between 18-31 degrees C, but as we all know they can, on occasion, soar into the high 30's and even into the 40's. Rainfall, by and large, is minimal and humidity tends to be low most of the time. To counter these changes, we can reduce temperatures by shading, the use of fans and by the use of evaporative coolers. Watering will have to be more frequent to cope with increased evaporation, and damping down of the floors to try and increase humidity. Plants can be fertilised, but try and avoid that on very hot days.

Look out for pests at this time, as with the increased temperatures they multiply more rapidly.

The ones I find most frequently on the plants are scale insects which need to be treated with something like pest oil. Do not, however, carry out the treatment on a very hot day as this could lead to death of the leaf, as the oily coating while smothering the insect, also tends to block the pores on the leaf leading to excessive heating.

Most plants will also by now, be tending to mature their pseudo bulbs and flower sheaths will be appearing on the autumn flowering ones. Make sure these bulbs are properly staked erect and are facing in the same direction as when you removed them to make any adjustments.

There may be some plants flowering, or close to doing so, that may need some protection form the excessive heat and can be brought into the house for a short period of a couple of days at a time, if you so desire.

Howard waters the plant 3-4 times per week in summer and fertilises weekly with Aquasol, Polyfeed, or whatever he can lay his hands on, and in winter cuts back watering and feeding to once every 3-4 weeks.
