CYMBIDIUM CULTURAL NOTES (JULY/AUGUST 2010) by Roy Brown

During the next two months, the flower spikes on the Spring flowering varieties of Cymbidiums will grow very rapidly. The most important part of the culture will be caring for the flower spikes, training those that need straightening, and seeing they receive the proper protection and shade conditions.

Staking is very important, so if you find a flower stem not growing straight, then insert a stake as close to the base of the pseudo bulb as possible and gently ease the spike up to the stake and tie it firmly. When tying the spike do not tie it too tightly as the stem will still lengthen, so take care not to restrict the growth.

A slug or a caterpillar has only to damage one bud to spoil the whole spike.

Aphis, mosquitos, fruit fly, ants and all other biting pests will be attracted to the flower buds, and these too will leave a damage mark. I find Rose Dust, lightly dusted on the buds, very effective in getting rid of these pests. It is not advisable to use a liquid form of insecticide on the pkants once the flower buds are visible, it could cause malformed flowers.

CATTLEYA CULTURAL NOTES (JULY/AUGUST 2010) by Henry Eaton

We have been experiencing in early July unseasonably cold, dry weather. This type of cold requires appropriate culture. As discussed last month, preserving the integrity of your plants roots is probably the most important thing. This is especially relevant because of the frequent frosty nights we have experienced. Cattleyas normally can easily survive the odd cold day, but roots are damaged when they are wet and it becomes very cold. To counter this it is helpful to have a covering of some kind over the growing area to ward off any rain or frost.

Watering of plants has to be confined to days on which the forecasts predict a relatively sunny day with the following night temperature not falling too low. If watering has to be suspended due to the cold, humidity may drop, so you compensate for this by watering the floor and surrounds of the plants. If you only have a few plants, they could be grown on trays containing water while the pots stand on gravel above the waterline. Maintaining humidity is even more important if you grow your plants in a heated glasshouse or bring the plants into the home.

Misting these plants early in the day will also help. The cold and decreased watering means that the plants will be in a dormant, resting phase and fertilizer could be dispensed with temporarily, until the weather warms up and early signs of growth reappear.

Flower buds appearing at this time usually take a long time to open and need to be protected against slugs, snails and insects.

Fungal infections can be avoided by allowing for good air movement around the plants.
