

CYMBIDIUM CULTURAL NOTES (MAY/JUNE 2010) by Roy Brown

By June the sun will have moved to its most northerly position, and so will not harm (burn) Cymbidiums if they are given full sunlight all day long. However it is still strong enough to cause the bloom of the lighter coloured Cymbidiums to be discoloured. This discolouring shows as a brown stripe on the back of the flower sepals, ans is particularly noticeable on the lighter coloured flowers. If you want your blooms to keep their fresh colour, then move them into the flowering house once the flower buds are seen, as this way you can adjust the amount of light and shade to suit each different coloured plant.

The early flowering plants will have spikes well advanced by now, some of the early ones will in fact be open. Take extra care with these plants - once the flower buds are visible wrap a dry piece of cotton wool around the flower stem like a collar as this does help to keep slugs and snails away from the flower buds. You must take care though when watering; should the cotton wool become wet it will no longer be effective.

Now the plants are producing their spikes, I like to use a fertilizer that has a higher percentage of potash. There is approximately four times as much plant fibre needed for the formation of a flower spike than what goes into the making of a pseudo bulb, so your plant will need this extra potash to produce strong spikes.

You will need to watch the weather from now on with regard to watering. Now the weather is cooler, there is less evaporation from the pot, so there is no need to water as heavily. However, always keep the compost damp, don't allow it to dry out under any circumstances, particularly now the spikes are growing.

CATTLEYA CULTURAL NOTES (MAY/JUNE 2010) by Henry Eaton

Since the last review of culture in the bulletin for April/May, the weather has been a succession of bright, warm days with cold nights to slow down the opening of the buds that have developed. This was evident with the plant numbers shown at the Autumn Show.

Watering frequency will have to be adjusted to the temperatures experienced, less often when it is cold and more when there is no rain and the days are warmer. You could estimate the dryness of a pot by holding up a plant soon after watering and compare it to when it was drier before watering. Remember all moves that you make with changes in culture are geared to keeping the roots healthy. It is a healthy root system that gives you a good plant. Roots do not like to be kept very damp when the temperatures are low. If there is any doubt about whether to water or not, postponing it for a day or two is better than watering on a cold wet day. Fertiliser can be used but remember plants will not use much of it because plant growth has slowed.

Keep a lookout for slugs and snails that will enjoy dining on the flower buds if they can reach them.

Stake and position plants so as to display the flowers well.
