## CYMBIDIUM CULTURAL NOTES (NOVEMBER/DECEMBER 2010) by Roy Brown

Repotting should be in full swing, but by the middle of November the temperature will be fairly high, so it would be advisable to have all the repotting done as quickly as possible before the hot days set in.

When repotting your plants try not to break them up into sections that are too small, a three bulb piece will have a better chance of flowering the following year.

Try not to over pot your plant. Select a pot that will hold the plant and its root system, and will allow for a further two years growth.

When you are repotting, hold the plant firmly in one hand with the bulb just below the top of the pot, and using your fingers work the fresh pine bark between the plant's roots.

Fill the pot with Ausgro medium grade potting mix, firming the bark as you go. The plant should now be sitting neatly in the centre of the pot with the base of the bulb just below the top of the bark. Give the plant a good watering and place it in a cool, shady position for about a week until the roots start into active growth again.

Now the flower spikes have been cut and the plants are back in the shade house once again, check to make sure there is no repair work needed on the roof or walls of the Sarlon shade cloth shade house. Should the Sarlon cloth become unstitched or torn, then repair it as soon as possible. During the next few months the sun's rays are shining more directly over the plants, and if it should shine through a hole in the roof section, the plants below could suffer bad leaf burn. Besides looking unsightly, leaf burn also affects the efficiency of the plant in producing the necessary plant sugars.

Cymbidiums will stand quite a considerable amount of bright light, but during a heat wave the sun should not shine directly onto the plants leaves.

## CATTLEYA CULTURAL NOTES (NOVEMBER/DECEMBER 2010) by Henry Eaton

Because of the lack of rain this year we will all need to be careful about wasting water. There are some moves we can make that should help. As the temperature rises with the onset of summer there will be greater loss of water from the plants from evaporation. To counter this we can keep the plans more shaded than before, the floor moist to increase humidity and fans runig at slow speeds to cool the plants. Cooling can also be achieved by the use of evaporative coolers that come on when the temperature rises above limits that you set. Watering of the plants by hand is helpful as it gives you a chance of viewing the plants more closely and taking action without delay. If you lift up a pot from the bench you should be able to gauge whether it is heavy (due to the mix being wet) or light when the mix is dry.

At this time of the year the emphasis is on promoting growth as much as possible. This means providing good light, sufficient water, the suppression of insect attacks by detecting it early and applying the correct treatment without delay, and using fertilizers on a regular basis. As this is a growing phase Nitrogen should be available in higher quantity than at other times of the year. Aim for producing new growths with light green leaves, not dark green which indicates too little light reaching the plant, and this would affect flowering later. Fertilizing with a weak solution is all that is needed, provided it is done regularly.
