CYMBIDIUM CULTURAL NOTES (FEBRUARY/MARCH 2011) by Roy Brown

This is the tme of the year when the young flower spikes are starting to develop, so a drop in the temperature during the evening is a very vital part of the successful flowering of Cymbidiums. By turning on the overhead sprinklers in the early evening, the temperature in the shade house will drop quite a few degrees and this will create the ideal conditions necessary for the growing and flowering of our plants.

Always have a good check over your pots regularly to make sure the drainage is not blocked. Water should pass through the compost freely, not just seep away

Keep the regular fertilizing programme going, the new seasons growths still need to be kept growing at a fast rate so they will develop sufficiently to produce their flowers when the time comes.

If you should be poking about your plants looking for these early flowering spikes during March, do be very careful as they are very easily broken or damaged. Should you have to remove a pot that has definite signs of flower spikes showing, be very careful to replace it in the exact same position (with the flower spike facing the same direction as before).

With the advent of flower spikes showing, it might be a good idea to give the shade house a clean up, getting rid of all dead leaves, weeds and anything else that could harbor pests.

It would also be a good idea, during the next month, to make sure you have a good supply of pots and compost ready for those repotting jobs next month.

CATTLEYA CULTURAL NOTES (FEBRUARY/MARCH 2011) by Henry Eaton

The summer heat has not let up as yet, so the measures advocated last month should still be followed - namely the use of fans, extra shade cloth if needed, frequent watering of the floor to create increased humidity and more thorough watering if indicated.

Try not to repot or pot on plants at this time because they would be exposed to heat stress. If, however, you cannot avoid it and otherwise risk losing the plant, try to keep the plant in a cool shaded location and use Seasol to counter stress in the plant.

At this time some plants will be showing signs of flowering with the appearance of buds or sheaths. Tie the pseudo bulbs up vertically so that the flowers would display well when they open. If buds alone appear in the depths of the leaf axil, they are very prone to rot if water collects around them. This means moving them from near an overhead sprinkler and checking regularly that the problem has been controlled. Any residual water can be removed using some water absorbent tissues.

Fertilisation using a high potash make is indicated at this time to promote flowering and strengthen cell walls before winter.
