CYMBIDIUM CULTURAL NOTES (JANUARY /FEBRUARY 2011) by Roy Brown

During the next few months, we can expect very hot, dry weather and with it easterly winds that dry the potting mix out very quickly. So we must give out plants extra protection to enable them to keep growing during the summer months.

Cymbidiums will not grow in a hot, dry position; they must receive plenty of moisture and humidity.

Next, see to it that the plants receive the correct amount of shade. You can't allow the sun to shine directly on the plants or they will get bad leaf burn. I find 50% Sarlon Shade Cloth gives the best protection, anything lighter than this will allow the plants' leaves to burn during a heat wave. At this time of the year you may find the Cymbids leaves have become a yellowy green in colour. This is because of the high light intensity we experience during the summer months, there being very little cloud to break the sun's rays. I don't consider this slight yellowing of the leaves to be detrimental to the plant, however, I could suggest that you use a fertilizer with a higher content of Nitrogen during the summer (or growing period) and then switch over to one having more Potash when flower spikes start to show.

Finally don't let any weeds get a hold in the pots, get at them as soon as they show. With the extra water and fertilizer the plants are now getting, weeds can ecome a pest and rob the plant of its nutrient.

CATTLEYA CULTURAL NOTES (JANUARY/FEBRUARY 2011) by Henry Eaton

This is usually the hottest period in summer with low humidity, bright light. And little or no rain. Culture should. Therefore, be geared to counter these changes.

Beating the heat may be achieved by installing fans, the usage of an evaporative cooler and some increase in the shading with, if necessary, another layer of shade cloth. If possible this layer should be held about a foot above the existing layer so as to allow the air to circulate beneath it.

Watering frequency needs to be increased because of the higher rate of drying out of the mix, while the low humidity is tackled by keeping the floor of the greenhouse damp.

When watering, give the plants a good soaking so that the water escapes from the drainage holes of the pot quite freely. Do not water again until the weight of the pot is significantly lighter. Good root growth is enhanced by this type of wet/dry cycle. Keeping the mix wet all the time restricts oxygen penetration into the mix with the possibility of rotting. If in doubt about watering, erring on the side of dryness is better than keeping the mix too wet.

As the plants are in full growth, fertilizing should be kept up, with the proviso that it is done on a day when the temperatures are in the low 30's or below.

Many of the plants may by now. Be showing flowering sheaths and should be staked appropri-
