CYMBIDIUM CULTURE NOTES (JULY/AUGUST) by Roy Brown

This month the early flowering Cymbidiums will be in flower. Others will have flower buds showing through the protective sheaths on the stem. Once they reach the stage where the flower buds are visible, it's time to move the plants out of the shade house and into the flowering section where more protection can be given to them. Heavy rain or hail can chip the soft buds and so leave a permanent mark, also strong winds can cause the leaves to rub on the flowers and this too will cause a blemish.

Cymbidiums like to grow in a position where there is plenty of free air movement, so don't completely enclose the flowering section like a glass house. This could be the reason for bud drop. Give them protection from the heavy rains, and close off the sides which face the strongest winds. Don't overcrowd your plants, give them plenty of room between each pot if possible.

During July we can expect cold, wet wintry weather. Fertilising can be tapered off to once a fortnight. Watering will also depend on the weather, but don't allow the pots to become dry, particularly those in spike or under cover.

Keep the shade house and flowering house well baited with slug and snail pellets, particularly now that the flower buds are showing.

CATTLEYA CULTURE NOTES (JULY/AUGUST) by Henry Eaton

The weather has now got colder but during the day it is warmer when the sun shines. This calls for a continuation of the cultural practices outlined in the last OSWA Bulletin.

With those flowers coming into bloom, it is wise to place them under cover so that the rain cannot get to them, leading invariably to Botrytis spotting on the petals. If you note any infection starting, separate the plants to give them more fresh air and hang them up if possible. An antifungal spray of the plant may help but prevention is better than cure.

As most of your plants will now be resting because of the cold weather, watering need only be done when there is no rain forecast and the sun is out and has dried out the mixture in the pots.

Fertiliser used at this time is unlikely to have much effect. Resting plants do not require frequent watering and fertilisers can be withheld until growth recommences.

Plants in flower can be brought into the house for display but kept away from heaters etc which dry the air out and lead to the flowers lasting only a short period. Take them back to their normal growing positions outside every 3-4 days to help the flowers last as long as possible.
