Vale Ken Rex: 2 May 1921 – 3 June 2011

Ken joined the Society in 1962 and was Secretary of OSWA when Jim & I joined the society in 1969. Ken lost his wife Joan later that year. He became President in 1973 for 2 years, and again in 1978 for 3 years. Ken was a judge from 1970 and was a fantastic designer of our shows. We used to have working bees making props for the shows and this was enjoyed by the members who attended. Ken wrote the miscellaneous notes for the Bulletin from April 1976 through to August 1988. He was Registrar of the Judging Panel from August 1986 until September 1988. Ken has been Patron of OSWA since 1992. A Life Membership was bestowed on Ken in 1974 for all the work he had done for the Society.

Ken grew beautiful orchids, especially Phalaenopsis. One of his Phalaenopsis Judith x Doris won the 1969 Championship at the Perth Town Hall. This plant had 132 white blooms on 4 inflorescences. I can remember it being absolutely spectacular, and I think that was when I said "one day I will grow this genera of orchids!" Hasn't really happened as yet, perhaps one day! Ken married Dixie and they moved from Yokine to Samson. Dixie passed away September 2008. Ken was a perfectionist with everything he did. He joined the Wood Turners Club and the work he has done is amazing. His trophy for the Most Points for a Novice Grower was always a well sort after trophy because it was one of Ken's wood carvings. Ken has carved orchids into some of our trophies to represent what genera the trophy is given for.

Ken had a stroke in December 2010, and had fought back strongly to get back on track, having just begun to walk without the walking frame, before suffering a setback and sadly passing away.

Ken you will be truly missed by us all. A great supporter of OSWA, a true friend for 42 years of Jim & me and of many other older members of the Society. Goodbye dear friend, 'til we meet again. Our love and prayers to his children Judith, John, Merilyn and their families. To his brother Bob, our deepest sympathy.

CYMBIDIUM CULTURE NOTES (JUNE/JULY) by Roy Brown

The next two months are cold wet months, with windy and blustery weather. Cymbidiums will grow quite well under these cold wet conditions, provided the pots have good drainage, allowing all the excess rain water to drain away freely. Strong winds can tip the pots off the benches, causing damage to any young flower spikes, so I would advise you to protect the pots from very blustery weather.

Should you experience frosts in your particular district, then you will have to bring those plants in spike under cover when frost is forecast, otherwise the flower spike will wither and die if frost settles on it overnight.

The flower spikes will need to be trained as they develop if you want them to be presentable. Don't just allow them to grow out over the edge of the pot in an unruly fashion. Tie them to stakes and train them so that eventually when the flowers open, they will present themselves in a pleasing manner. This does make a difference to the whole appearance to the plant, if you are going to exhibit it in any of the forthcoming shows. This is absolutely a must!

If some of the plants are discarding some of the leaves from the older pseudo bulbs, then clean them up from the shade house floor. Don't leave them lying around to rot, this is where the insect pests could breed. Keep the Cymbidium house nice and clean from weeds and rubbish.

CATTLEYA CULTURE NOTES (JUNE/JULY) by Henry Eaton

With the onset of cold wintery weather, the foremost consideration is adjusting cultural practice to the cold. Orchid growth slows with the cold so the need for watering decreases and the use of fertilisers becomes a minor concern, unless your plants are being grown in a heated greenhouse. If your plants are grown in an open but covered area, to protect them from the rain, all shading, if not already, should be removed. This helps to warm the plants to some degree on sunny days and helps flowers opening now to do so with true colours. Heavily shaded plants appear to open flowers with less brightness in them. Due to the cold and dampness in the air, flowers are more likely to get infected with botrytis spores with the appearance of black spots on the petals. This can be averted to some degree by keeping the air moving gently over the plants with the use of a fan and avoiding overcrowding of the plants together. If the structure in which you grow your plants permits using hangers, pots hung up give flowering plants more space for flowers to open without obstruction and better air movement.

Flowering plants should also be closely observed for caterpillars and thrips which will damage them if untreated. Also make sure you have baits spread around to neutralize the snails and slugs that appear with the rain.

When watering, choose a forecasted sunny day to do so, so that the plants may dry out by nightfall and there is no water left in the axils of the leaves which could induce rots. It is also probably wise to wait until the sun is shining into your garden before watering, as by then the water in the pipes may have warmed up to some degree.

Avoid all potting activity, unless not doing so might kill the plant.
