CYMBIDIUM CULTURAL NOTES (MARCH/APRIL 2011) by Roy Brown

The hot summer weather pattern will continue during March, with the temperature well in the high 30'sC range, so creating enough humidity to combat the dryness will be our biggest job.

This is the period of the year when the early flowering Cymbidiums are producing their flower spikes. It is vital during the summer months that a decided drop in temperature is experienced during the evenings for the successful flowering of Cymbidiums, and so it is necessary that the plants receive a good watering in the early evening so this effect can take place.

Should you be handling your pots or looking for signs of early flower spikes, be very careful as they are easily damaged in their early stages of growth. I like to insert a thin stake in each pot as a sign that a flower spike is present, as I find them. It is also a reminder to be careful when passing that particular plant. Should you have to remove a plant that has definite signs of spikes, be very careful to replace the pot in exactly the same position as before, ie with the flower spike facing the same direction. This may not seem very important now, but will save the disappointment later on of having bent and twisted flower stems.

Keep up with the summer culture, that is plenty of light, plenty of water and your regular fertilising programme, with perhaps the a fertiliser having a little more Potash content.

Don't forget, you can order fresh supplies for orchid growing and potting at the Opportunity Table at each General Meeting.

CATTLEYA CULTURAL NOTES (MARCH/APRIL) by Henry Eaton

Although Autumn has arrived we are still largely experiencing summer weather with hot, dry days. There has been, however, a lowering of the night temperature into the high teens or low twenties. These changes then indicate that we should persist with watering the plants as in summer but avoid watering late in the day, so as to let them dry out by evening. The cool nights, combined with high day temperatures, means that growth can recommence in your plants. There is, at this time therefore, a window of opportunity between mid-March and mid-May to repot or divide plants that missed out being dealt with in Spring. Because temperatures may be high at times, it is best that you do not adjust the shading over the plants just yet.

Most of your mature plants should now be showing signs of an intention to flower with the appearance of buds or flower sheaths. When watering, try and avoid water collecting in the leaf axils, which leads to rotting of the buds. A high Potassium fertilizer or blossom boost one can now be employed at weekly or fortnightly intervals. Continue to stake up pseudo bulbs that will flower, so that the flowers, when they appear, will be well displayed. To promote a good display also arrange for the pots to be separated one from the other, so there is space for the flowers to open fully. A close watch has also got to be kept for possible attack by caterpillars, thrips, snails and slugs. Deal with them as appropriate. Also this is a good time to clean out the growing area of old fallen leaves, flowers etc. If in this process the plants are moved, make sure they are realigned in the direction they were pointing, as otherwise there may be twisting of the emerging buds or flowers on the spike.

As May is the start of the Show season, prepare your plants from now to appear there and good wishes for a successful result.
