

CYMBIDIUM CULTURAL NOTES (May/June 2011) by Roy Brown

The hot summer weather pattern continued on through March and April, and here it is May and finally a noticeable drop in daytime temperatures.

The early flowering Cymbidiums have produced their flower spikes and some have their flower buds protruding through the protective leaf on the stem. Extra care should always be taken when handling these plants s they are easily damaged.

Watering is still vital during the next month and when fertilizing, a little extra Potash to help the young flower buds to develop.

As I mentioned last month, should you be handling the pots or looking for signs of young flower buds, be very careful to replace the pot with the young flower spike facing the same direction as before, this will save the plant having bent and twisted flower stems.

CATTLEYA CULTURAL NOTES (MAY/JUNE 2011) by Henry Eaton

Autumnal weather has at last been established with relatively cold nights and warm days. This has meant that those plants that flower in Autumn have begun to do so with plenty of blooms. The weather forecasting boffins predict that the La Nina effect that has been determining our weather patterns is now diminishing, and normal weather patterns for this time of year should return.

As always culture of your plants will be determined on the prevailing weather. Because of the cold there will be a slowing down of activity in the plant so that watering needs will lessen and fertilization can be reduced to once month or so.

This is not a good time for repotting unless the mix in the pot has deteriorated badly or new roots are being formed and are over the edge of the pot. In the latter instance, an alternative is to place the whole plant in a larger pot without disturbing the mix and fill the remaining space with moist fresh mix. Repotting can be completed in Spring. The other method is to place a pot full of mix beneath the roots spilling over so they can establish themselves in it and not be air pruned as would otherwise occur. As the intensity of the sun now declines, all shading can be removed and the plants will benefit from the increased warmth and light.

To protect the flowers from spotting with Botrytis, try and maintain a good flow of air around the plants by hanging them up or keeping a fan blowing gently over the plants. The flowers also need protection from slugs and snails by placing baits in the pot and near the flower sheath. Also keep water off the flowers by hand watering into the pot and growing the flowering plants where they are out of reach of the rain.

After flowering, plants can be grown in an area where they can experience a rest period, during which they receive little or no water, until they show signs of activity again with the appearance of new roots or a swelling growth bud at the base of the pseudo bulb.

OSWA AUTUMN SHOW RESULTS

The Autumn Show held at Stocklands Riverton Shopping Centre was a small but pleasing display arranged with Kaye's usual finesse.

<u>Grand Champion</u> was Phalaenopsis Orchid World 'Zuma Canyon' owned by Peter and Shirley Masters. This plant was flowering on racemes that had not been cut off for four years because of the progressive nature of the plant.

<u>Reserve Champion</u> was Phragmipedium Sorcerer's Apprentice owned by Maxine Godbeer. This plant displayed very tall racemes and again is a progressive flowerer so exhibits flowers over a long period of time. This plant has been in flower almost continuously since last June, as racemes reach the end of their life there are others taking their place

<u>Champion Laeliinae Alliance</u> was Blc. Pastel Pageant 'April Delight'. Another beautiful plant

Best Novice Entry was Blc. Kabooki owned and grown beautifully by Merrilyn Brechin
