#### CYMBIDIUM CULTURAL NOTES (JULY/AUGUST 2012) by Roy Brown

The most important job with our Cymbidiums for the next month will be caring for the flower spikes and training those that need straightening up, seeing they receive the proper shade conditions to bring out the best colour in the blooms.

During July the flower spikes grow rapidly, and by now the majority of the flower buds will be visible. August will see the spikes lengthen further, and the flower buds space themselves out on the stem in readiness for flowering. It's from this stage onwards that they have to be watched carefully.

Heavy rain or hail can spoil your flower buds, so the plants will need to be moved into the flowering section, where a close watch can be kept on the progress of the spikes. Also watch that the wind doesn't cause the plant leaves to knock or rub against the flower buds. This quite often happens and a small mark on the buds at this stage will show up as a bad blemish on the flower sepals later when it opens.

Plants that are under cover for protection should be watered regularly. If these are allowed to dry out you'll run the risk of bud drop.

Finally this month, make sure you have sufficient flower pots and a good supply of compost on hand, ready for the re-potting jobs that can be started next month.

#### CATTLEYA CULTURAL NOTES (JULYAUGUST 2012) by Henry Eaton

July and August are usually the coldest months of the year. This seems to be holding true as I write. Culture of your Cattleyas depend on keeping the plants out of the rain so that the roots are not sitting in a cold, wet mix, which if maintained for a while will result in death of the roots. Watering can be done on a bright day, as early in the day as possible, so that the plant can dry out as much as possible before the cold night sets in. Also remember, that Cattleyas like to dry out between watering, so they may only need to be watered two or three times for the month. If fertilizing your plants, this could perhaps be done once in the month, because the cold would induce dormancy at this time.

There still may be some plants, that because of their genetic inheritance, show signs of new growth with the appearance of new roots at this time. If any of these are spotted and they need potting on or re-potting, this should be done now, as if left for later they may not form new roots again.

Protect buds and flowering sheaths, and keep a constant look out for snails and slugs, and bait for them.

#### PAPHIOPEDILUM CULTURAL NOTES (JULY/AUGUST 2012) by Trevor Burnett

These are the truly wonderful months and most rewarding for Paphiopedilum growers, especially of the exhibition type clones. We should be flush with flowers, with some of our old favourites flowering again, and some new seedling we have been eagerly waiting to flower for several years finally producing flowers. In many cases for new seedlings, we experience disappointment, or indeed sheer joy at the quality of the flowers.

My watering programme is still at 14 day intervals, but I may give additional watering if the weather is fine and sunny for 6-8 days in a row.

With the flowers now fully in bloom, it is time to re-assess your collection and decide what plants you are going to keep or dispose of as surplus. It is also a good time to work out whether you are short on any particular colours or types, so you can purchase new seedlings or divisions from other growers, who may be disposing of surplus divisions accordingly.

I still will give the flowering plants fertilizer on a fortnightly or monthly basis.

The smaller un-flowered plants will still require fertilizer, at  $\frac{1}{4}$  to  $\frac{1}{2}$  strength (on a fortnightly or monthly basis), to keep the growths moving forward.

Flowers can be left on 2-3 growth plants without harm, as long as the plants are healthy and are showing good strong growths. With smaller plants, flowering for the first time on a single growth and not showing signs of a secondary growth, the quick removal of the flowers will facilitate the best growth. Thus promoting new growth will ensure strong growths and flowers in future years. The flower can be enjoyed as a cut flower for some time.

#### **Tips for Showing Plants**

With a great deal of shows around now, you should ensure that your plants are free from any bugs, especially mealy bug, before you contemplate getting the plants ready for the various shows. If mealy bugs are detected, they should be treated before entered in shows. Taking some time to prepare your plants will ensure all your growing efforts are presented at their best for judging.

#### Soft-bodied bugs, such as aphids & mealy bugs:

Straight 70% or 90% alcohol (methylated spirits) – touch insects with a soaked cotton swab, or for larger infestations, spray the entire affected plant with a 50/50 mix with water, being sure to wet all surfaces. Repeat every 3 days for about 2 weeks.

I suggest you ensure that you:

(a) Present clean pots

(b) Remove dead leaves from plants before showing

(c) Clean foliage of any old sprays, dirt or dust. When wiping down leaves, hold the leaves at the base and wipe to the tip. This will prevent leaves being inadvertently pulled off, especially on newer growths.

(d) Ensure the plants are correctly labeled and readable.

(e) Ensure plants are neatly staked without excessive ties.

Selected works will be displayed at the 19<sup>th</sup> AOC Conference being held at the Burswood Entertainment Complex 13-16<sup>th</sup> September 2012.

<u>The Conference Lecture Programme:</u> Unfortunately Mike Coronado cannot be with us in September, but Robert Fuchs will step in & give two lectures, one on Vandaceous Intergenerics & the other on Vandaceous Culture. Bob's R.F. Orchids, of Florida, USA has been the recipient of numerous awards for his breeding of Vandas & allied genera over the years. He has won many FCC/AOS awards (the First class Certificate, the highest flower quality award) & also many CCM/AOS awards for orchid culture. We are proud to have Bob Fuchs as part of our hugely experienced Lecture Program.

Extensive Media Campaign: Negotiations with a number of media entities, radio, newspaper & electronic are now complete& we can announce that we have completed sponsorship arrangements with the top rating Perth radio station 6PR & the states leading newspaper The West Australian. We have also concluded arrangements with leading television station Channel 7, Perth for extensive advertising in the weeks leading to the Show. Discussions with the Community Newspapers are on-going, & there have been numerous articles in The West Australian & in Seniors Newspapers. All this will give the AOC Conference a huge coverage across the Perth area & the state of Western Australia.

<u>Bringing Cut flowers to the Show?</u> With the assistance of staff of the WA Dept. of Agriculture & Food, a simplified process for bringing non-commercial quantities of cut flowers to WA for the orchid show has been developed. A single permit will be issued by AgWa to enable societies & individuals wishing to bring cut orchid flowers to Perth for the show. It will be available as a downloadable document from the conference website. Any person bring cut flowers with them, will need to have in their possession, a copy of this permit when they enter WA. All cur orchid flowers brought to WA will need to be inspected before they can be judged or placed in a display. An inspector will be at Burswood between 8:30 am & 12:30 pm on Tuesday 11<sup>th</sup> September to conduct these inspections. There is no charge for this service which is only available to bona fide non-commercial exhibitors. As you enter your orchid, or bring your cut flowers for your display, you will be directed to the inspector, who will be situated close to the entry desk. We ask that you co-operate in this regard as AgWa staff have been very responsive to our request for assistance to make it as simple as possible for Eastern states exhibitors. <u>Commercial quantities</u> of cut orchid flowers will need to follow standard import application & inspection procedures, or which a fee is payable.

Bringing live orchid plants for sale? Commercial quantities of orchid plants, <u>bare root if not inspected in the state of origin</u>, or <u>in</u> <u>media if inspected in state of origin</u>, will be inspected at Burswood on Tuesday afternoon unless otherwise arranged. A fee is payable for this service & will need to be paid at the time the inspection is conducted.

Purchasing plants to take home to NSW, Vic. SA NT or Tas? Registrants & visitors from NSW, Vic, & SA purchasing plants to take home with them will require certification that the plants have been inspected & found to be free from green snail. Qld presently has no restrictions, and we are awaiting further clarification of NT & Tas requirements. A summary of this information is available on the conference webpage. The Dept. of Agriculture & Food will arrange for an inspector to be at Burswood between 1:30pm & 4:30pm on Friday 14<sup>th</sup> September to conduct plant inspections & issue the certification required by the other states. The charge for this service is time based at \$56 per 15 min., during which it estimated an inspector can inspect 10 plants. For simplicity, the overall charge for this service (AgWa will provide these details to us). If you are not able to have your plants inspected at this time, you will have to make an appointment AgWa Quarantine WA quality Assurance Officer on 08 9334 1800 to have plants inspected at their Fricker Road premises (adjacent to the International Airport) during the following week. Payment for this service can be made to AgWa by cash or credit card.

<u>Re-brand Announcement:</u> In line with the announcement that Burswood Entertainment Complex will change its name to Crown Perth later in 2012, InterContinental Perth Burswood & Holiday Inn Perth Burswood hotels will also undergo a complete rebrand. Upon completion of the refurbishment in July, InterContinental Perth Burswood will change its name to Crown Metropol & Holiday Inn Perth Burswood will re-brand as Crown Promenade.
