General News

Vale Maxine Godbeer

Maxine Godbeer was part of our orchid community for over 30 years. She had an immense knowledge of orchids, their culture, and judging. While Maxine enjoyed hybrid orchids and had quite a few excellent examples in her collection, her specialty was species orchids. Maxine's collection included many rare and beautiful species from many genera. Who can forget her magnificent *Dendrochilum* (now *Ceologyne*) specimens or her elegant *Aerangis citrata*? Maxine's orchids were highlights at so many shows and monthly meetings over the years.

Maxine joined OSWA with her late husband John on 17th December 1993. So enthusiastic was she about orchids that she wanted to learn more, so she joined the Orchid Judging Panel of WA as a student judge 1994, advancing to associate judge in 1995 and becoming an AOC accredited judge in 1998. Maxine served as OSWA's Registrar from 2001 until she became Registrar of the OJPWA in 2014. For as long as I've been in OSWA, Maxine (with Trevor Burnett) coordinated OSWA's entries in the intersociety competitions. Her talents were no doubt a significant factor in OSWA's success at the intersociety competitions over the years.

The Registrar in the OJPWA is essentially "the boss", and in that capacity Maxine presided over judging at shows and monthly meetings, and training of new judges. Since Maxine's orchid collection was so diverse and contained so many outstanding plants, it was great tool for judges training— whenever an orchid was needed for study, there was a fair to middling chance that an example would be available in Maxine's collection! Consequently, judges training sessions were run at her home for many years, starting during Jim O'Hare's time as OJPWA Registrar, and continuing during Maxine's own tenure. Trainee judges invariably arrived at Maxine's place early on training days so they could browse through Maxine's hothouse and shadehouse before training started—there was always something interesting to see. A highlight of the training sessions was always the lunch Maxine provided, and especially her spicy pumpkin soup!

Maxine enjoyed sharing her knowledge of orchids especially through the judges training program, as well as in presentations on various topics to orchid clubs, and as Bulletin Editor at OSWA for a number of years. Her enthusiasm was never dampened by the tyranny of distance. Despite living in Parkerville, far from most orchid events, Maxine regularly travelled to monthly meetings and shows of orchid clubs across Perth, often to several events a week, and sometimes as far as Albany and Geraldton, to judge, to give present an informative talk, or to show her own plants. Maxine felt that it was time to retire from the role of Registrar at the end of 2022, but when no other judge was willing or able to take over, Maxine reluctantly but cheerfully continued as Registrar for another term. After she finally

retired from the Registrar position at the end of 2023, she of course remained active on the Judging Panel, and was looking forward to helping train three new student judges.

Maxine's contributions to OSWA were recognised by the awarding of life membership in December 2022. Not surprisingly given her interest in species orchids, Maxine was also very active in the Species Orchid Society of WA. Maxine was a founding member and a life member of SOSWA, and served a term as the club's Vice President, two terms as President, four years as Secretary, and as committee member for many years.

Maxine passed away, suddenly and unexpectedly, on Saturday, 16 March 2024. We can be thankful that until the end Maxine was healthy and active, looking after her wonderful orchid collection, generously giving of her time for the orchid community, sharing her knowledge, and planning for the future. Rest in peace Maxine.

Meet our new President — Annette Gelfi

My name is Annette Gelfi, and in February 2024 I became the new President of OSWA, taking over the role from Lina Pacca.

I grew up in a family of orchid enthusiasts (my mother grows cymbidiums and my uncle was a commercial grower in Darwin) but didn't discover my passion for orchids until about 8 years ago when I lived in the US and started collecting phalaenopsis orchids.

I joined OSWA in late 2022 after visiting the OSWA stand at the Perth Garden and Outdoor Living Festival and meeting the enthusiastic club members there. At this month's general meeting



A few months ago, you may have seen the feature about Kevin Butler on Gardening Australia on ABC TV. Kevin is the owner of Ezi-Gro Orchids, the largest specialist orchid retailer in WA, and he's also an expert grower and hybridizer, and an orchid judge. At this month's general meeting, we are fortunate to have Kevin as our guest speaker, talking about blue cattleyas. The picture here is from Ezi-Gro's Facebook page, and the caption there says "The first of a new cross to flower for us. The cross is C C.G. Roebling x Rth Volcano Blue. We have given it the cultivar name 'The Blues'." You'll certainly be feeling the blues if you miss Kevin's talk!

Monthly plant — Dendrobium aemulum

A couple of years ago, Enid won Best Species, Best Australian Native Species, Best Australian Native, Best Novice Entry, and Grand Champion (!!!) at our Kardinya Spring Show with her *Dendrobium aemulum*. Now OSWA *members* have an opportunity to add this species to their collection — *Dendrobium aemulum* is the club plant this month! Plants will be on sale at the April General Meeting for \$10 each. This price is subsidised by OSWA *and is only available to financial members*, so make sure you have paid your dues before trying to buy a plant!

These plants come from Barrita Orchids. From the Barrita web page: "This is a selfing of the Australian native species. We have been growing a plant of the super cute, miniature Dendrobium aemulum for over 25 years. It can be a



challenging plant to grow. But we have found that it likes hanging in a very well-drained media. We hang ours above the mature Cymbidiums. It gets watered every second day in Summer and twice a week in winter. These two year old plants are still small, but are ready to flower this winter (a couple did last year)."

Also at the April meeting, Harry will be demonstrating how to attach one of these plants to a mount.

Flinders Square Autumn Show — Wednesday 8 May - Saturday 11 May

The folks at Flinders Square Shopping Centre were so impressed by our efforts last year that we'll be back there for our Autumn Show again this year.

- Show Setup happens at Flinders Square Shopping Centre Wiluna Street, Yokine on Wednesday 8th May, from about 5:30 pm; entries received from 6 pm. Please aim to have your plants benched by 6:45 pm so judging can start promptly at 7:00 pm. For easy access to the show area, park near the Nangar Street entrance to the shopping centre.
- Show open to public Thursday 9 May to Saturday 11 May. Plant sales daily.

Now that the weather is finally getting a bit cooler, it's time to look about the shadehouse for plants coming into flower for our Flinders Square Autumn Show. Do a bit of staking if needed, take steps to protect the developing flowers from damage by the elements, and move plants to a flowering house or some other covered area if need be. Please make a special effort to have your plants ready for this show, for judging and/or the display. If you plan to bring plants for the display, show, or sales table, please do not water them on the day you are going to bring them in.

Roster, Sales Sheets, Entry Cards etc will be available at the April General Meeting. Sales sheets can also be downloaded from the "Info for Members" section of the OSWA website. If you have some plants that are not quite perfect enough to enter in the competition, please consider bringing them in for the display—the public will still appreciate them! If you don't have any plants in flower, come along anyway, to help set up and pack up the display, or look after the display and chat to members of the public. Also, please consider signing up for a shift or three in the roster to look after our display. No special skills are required, just enthusiasm for sharing your love of orchids with the public. There is a new coffee shop, a patisserie, a sushi place and a pizza place in the shopping centre in case you need sustenance.

OSWA Workshops at Bunnings Melville and Claremont

Thank you to Jacqui Bateman and Maggie Reisenberger for their workshop at Bunnings Melville on 17 April 2024. As usual, their presentation was informative, entertaining, and very well received. Thank you also to Jacqui Bateman (again) and Lina Pacca, who presented a workshop at Bunnings Claremont in 2023. That workshop was well received too, so much so that the folks at Claremont are very keen for OSWA to be involved in their Mothers Day event on 9 May 2024. Details are still to be confirmed, but the event is likely to be scheduled for 5-7 pm, and Lina and Jacqui will be there again to promote OSWA and orchids in general to members of the public.

We have been invited to contribute a display at the Koi Show again this year. The venue is the King Road Brewery in Olbury (which is down the Kwinana Freeway a bit, just north of Mundijong Road). As well as our display, there may be displays by one or two other garden-related clubs, there will be food and drink trucks, and, of course, there will be koi, lots and lots of koi. This event is not your usual orchid event but the koi are pretty interesting and it is fun to see folks as enthusiastic and fussy and nerdy about fish as we are about orchids. Many of the koi enthusiasts like orchids too. The event is free and open to everyone. As events go, this one is pretty simple for OSWA, we just need some plants in flower and a couple of volunteers to set up and watch over a small display, sell a few raffle tickets, and pack up at the end of the event. Orchids WA Matters

Orchids WA, the overarching orchid organisation in WA, had a meeting of club delegates on Saturday 20 April. Annette (OSWA delegate) and Murray (ANOSWA delegate) both attended. Several of items of interest to the local orchid community were referred back to the clubs for consideraton.

- (1) The 2025 Australian Orchid Council conference and show will be held in Woolgoolga NSW, from 1-5 October. For info, see <u>https://www.aoc2025.org.au</u>. Orchids WA is considering putting on a display to represent the WA orchid community and is seeking feedback from clubs as to whether such an activity is worthwhile and would be supported (in both thoughts and works!) by WA hobbyists.
- (2) South Eastern Orchid Society has proposed that Orchids WA provide support for any club willing to host the Intersociety Orchid Display and Workshop (the ISODW, which OSWA hosted last year). Support could be in the form of paying for cost of a suitable venue (should the hosts not be able to obtain financial support from other sources). Should Orchids WA be supporting the ISODW in this way, or in some other way?
- (3) Bruce Larson reported that Lotterywest is interested in helping Orchids WA stage an event, perhaps a mini conference either in Perth or regional WA, with efforts made to attract attendees and vendors from outside WA. There could be associated field trips or tours to see WA terrestrial orchids *in situ*. What are OSWA's thoughts about this idea?
- (4) Ken Jones reported on his work towards having Orchids WA import flasks directly from overseas vendors. So far, none of the overseas vendors contacted have been willing to undertake the additional accreditation required to allow them to send flasks directly into WA, and if accreditation were obtained, flasks could cost as much as \$300-\$400 dollars. Would OSWA want Orchids WA to continue to pursue potential importers regarding accreditation to import flasks into WA? Would any members be interested in purchasing flasks, given the predicted high cost to do so?

GENERAL CULTURE NOTES FOR DJERAN (April/May)

Djeran is the Noongar season where we start to see cooler temperatures and higher humidity, which provides some relief for our orchids, many of which can be quite stressed from Perth's hot dry summers. Unfortunately the pleasant weather is also favoured by pests, and a high degree of vigilance must be exercised to ensure outbreaks are proactively managed. Moisture and mold resistant snail pellets (yes, the more expensive ones) should be applied—snail activity increases with rainfall, as developing flower buds are a tasty snack. The milder weather also allows us to remove any 'additional' shade-cloth that may have been added in summer, and as rainfall begins, some protection from rain may be required for orchids coming into flower, and those orchids that require a dry rest through the cooler months. Some orchids slow down growth or go completely dormant as temperatures drop, and for these orchids, frequency of watering and fertilizing should be reduced, but orchids in active growth definitely still need feeding! It is a good time of the year to begin repotting, as the pleasant conditions help plants cope with the stress of being divided or repotted.

The following information is provided by Ken Jones. Members interested in bidding for plants are urged to arrive at the venue at 9 am on the day so ensure they have time to inspect the lots of interest before the scheduled auction start time of 10 am.

The auction of Maxine Godbeer's superb orchid collection is scheduled for Sunday 28 April commencing at 10.00 am at her home at 2195 Hidden Valley Road, Parkerville.

Inspection of plants as per the catalogue (below) will only be possible from 9.00 am the same day along with bidder registration (you must be registered to bid in the auction).

Parking on site and across the road is available. We recommend that members attending bring a chair, hat (some bidders will be in the sun) and water to drink as we expect the auction to take several hours. We sincerely thank Norm Stockton for agreeing to be our auctioneer, and Maxine's daughters Danielle and Wendy and their families for their help in preparing the collection for sale.

While we have endeavoured to find names for as many of the plants for sale as possible, there are a significant number of orchids that are unnamed where there are no name tags or the name that was once there has washed off. Where we could identify a number on a name tag or pot, as I have access the Maxine's numerical plant records, I have included the name and reference number. All lots will be sold as is with no warranty as to name, condition or freedom from insect pests or disease. There is no reserve on any lot and all sales will be final. Payment is to be made by cash or credit card prior to taking the lots purchased off site.

Could you please distribute this information to your members. Many will have personally known Maxine, and will be aware of her excellent species and hybrid orchid collection that will be sold including many of her prize-winning orchids. *Inspection of the orchids prior to the date of auction will not be permitted*, although as noted in the first paragraph, inspection is possible from 9.00 am until the auction commences.
